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KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Christy Todd, 2024 Georgia Teacher of the Year

Named the 2024 Georgia Teacher of the Year, Christy Todd is a music technology teacher who believes every child has a creative superpower.

In addition to teaching classes at Rising Starr Middle School in Fayetteville, Georgia, Todd is the founder of her district's Community for Creativity initiative, supporting schoolwide creation of songs, podcasts, videos, audio books and more, which are released through the school's recording label, Hall Pass Entertainment. Passionate about building opportunities for all students to create, Todd launched a special music collaboration between fine arts and special education classrooms that has impacted more than 10,000 students over the last 15 years.

Prior to teaching, Todd worked in business development in the nonprofit sector and draws from that experience to build connections between students, colleagues, families and communities. She began her teaching career as a chorus director and still actively conducts honor choirs, along with publishing articles and research for various state, national and international education journals.

Todd's career recognitions include 2013 Grammy Music Teacher of the Year National Quarterfinalist, 2016 Georgia Middle School Association's Teacher of the Year, 2022 Fayette County Public Schools Teacher of the Year, and was recently named one of four nationwide finalists for 2024 National Teacher of the Year. Todd received a Bachelor of Music Education from Shorter College, a Master of Music Education from Florida State University, and currently resides in Griffin, GA.

Artificial Intelligence and the Arts for the PreK-Grade 12 Classroom

Mood Boost: An Interactive Improv Experience

Join us for a joyful, extemporaneous experience! Improvisation ("improv") is a form of theater in which all elements of a story and scene are made up on the spot. In this interactive workshop, teachers will explore the curriculum for inspiration and practice the following rules: 1. Say "yes, and..." (follow your impulses); 2. Make your scene partners look amazing (listen and respond carefully); and 3. Fail boldly (lean into a brave and safe space). Participants will have the option to collaborate in small ensembles as actors onstage or enjoy the show from the audience (all levels welcome). Everyone will leave with a palpable mood boost from a good, shared laugh, as well as fresh ideas regarding improv as a practical tool for both academic and social-emotional learning.

Patterns in Abstraction: Black Quilts from the High's Collection

In conjunction with the High's upcoming exhibition Patterns in Abstraction: Black Quilts from the High's Collection, featured exhibition artist and educator Marquetta Johnson will be in conversation with Andrew Westover, Deputy Director for Learning and Civic Engagement. The two will discuss Johnson's quilting practice as well as the exhibition's broader consideration of Black women quilters and abstraction. Both speakers will then share practical strategies for educators, focusing on how teachers across disciplines can incorporate quilting in ways that engage and inspire learners of all ages.

Creative Fusion: Exploring Elementary Science, Movement, and Language Arts through Visual Arts Facilitated by: Emily Yewell Volin

Join Emily for an engaging session that seamlessly blends science, movement, English language arts, and visual arts to inspire creative expression. Through interactive activities, participants will delve into the concepts of reduce, reuse, and recycle, while immersing themselves in choreographic elements, word association, and recycled art. In addition to the artistic exploration, Yewell Volin will provide valuable insights into grant opportunities for arts education programming through the Georgia Council for the Arts (GCA), as well as details about the GCA Teaching Artist Registry. Don't miss this enriching session celebrating the intersection of creativity, education, and community engagement.

In their fast-gentrifying Harlem neighborhood, Preacher Henry and his wife Julia struggle to keep their congregation going in the face of development. When all seems lost, Henry asks God for help, and receives it in the form of an angel. But will this mysterious newcomer really help or make matters worse? Through it all, Julia must find her voice and the strength to lead their congregation through the crisis, reminding them that a church is not a building, but the people who inhabit it and the love they share. Featuring an original score by actor, comedian, and writer Tituss Burgess (TV's *Unbreakable Kimmy Schmidt*) and a book by actress, producer, and writer Azie Dungey (TV's *Harlem*), *The Preacher's Wife* is a can't-miss theatrical celebration of community, family, and faith.

History + Technology + Art = Tips for Applying Photography in an Elementary Arts Integration Classroom Facilitated by: Sarah Erickson

Explore history and current social truths with a gallery walk and discussion focused on photography, using the current High Museum of Art exhibition *Truth Told Slant* as a focal point. While exploring this ubiquitous art form, discover some highly engaging teaching strategies to encourage critical thinking in your students. You will learn fun modern tips, tools, and applications for digital photography. Finally, you will have the chance to be inspired by the pros and create your own art in the galleries.

Music and Media: Experiencing Film, TV, and Video Game Sound in the Secondary Classroom Facilitated by: Scott A. Stewart

Music for film, television, and video games is often the only contact with "symphonic sounds" experienced by students today. This workshop will explore how to present this rich and often familiar repertoire in creative ways to teach the elements of music and film, how music functions with visual image, and a hopping-off point for critical listening and analysis of music of all genres. Ideas for capstone projects such as podcasting and producing visual and audio content will be explored.

Personal Narrative Self-Portraits in Secondary Classrooms Facilitated by: Ondrian Reid

Artists often explore topics that are personally meaningful while striving to communicate a viewpoint. While looking at the figural art of Aaron Gilbert, Caledonia Curry, and other contemporary artists, educators will discover how to guide students through the creation of narrative self-portraits which tell a personal story or a specific social justice issue.

Playful Power of Puppets: Create and Integrate Puppetry into Your Early Learning Classroom Facilitated by: Anna Elizabeth Oakley

In this highly interactive workshop, participants will discover how puppetry in the early childhood classroom can enhance student's social emotional learning while making meaningful connections to concepts and themes. Utilizing puppetry strategies and techniques, participants will learn key skills to easily implement in the classroom. As a group, we will explore how to use puppets to introduce concepts, support transitions, and build empathy. Then, participants will have the opportunity to learn how different types of simple puppets can be made, build their own puppet, and work in small groups to create an original puppetry experience. Participants will leave the session with the tools to enhance their curriculum using their new classroom puppet creation (or newly built classroom puppet).

Piano superstar Daniil Trifonov joins the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra and music director Nathalie Stutzmann for the formidable Piano Concerto No. 2 by Johannes Brahms, a piece that is as sunny to the ear as it is fiendish for the pianist. With fistfuls of notes and a hint of Hungarian folk song, this winning concerto remains a concert-hall favorite. Also on the program, Maestro Stutzmann brings out a rarity for the orchestral music world, part of a collection of laments by the Elizabethan composer John Dowland. The evening concludes with the frolicking and exuberant Symphony No. 2 by Robert Schumann.

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
